SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

General information

First aider: Pay attention to self-protection! Remove affected person from the danger area and lay down. When in doubt or if symptoms are observed, get medical advice.

After inhalation

Provide fresh air. If experiencing respiratory symptoms: Get medical advice/attention. If breathing is irregular or stopped, administer artificial respiration.

Observe risk of aspiration if vomiting occurs. Rinse mouth immediately and drink 1 glass of of water. Do NOT induce vomiting. Adverse human health effects and symptoms: Gastric perforation. Call a physician immediately. Do not allow a neutralisation agent to be drunk. Get medical advice/attention.
